	The three bay one and one half story house on the East side of Brentwood Road opposite Sixth Avenue is a simple utilitarian building. The house can be located on the 1873 Atlas of Brentwood. At that time it belonged to T.C. George, a Civil War hero. The 1915 Atlas of Brentwood shows the house to be the property of F.E. Blacker. The simple, small house has remained virtually unchanged since that time.
