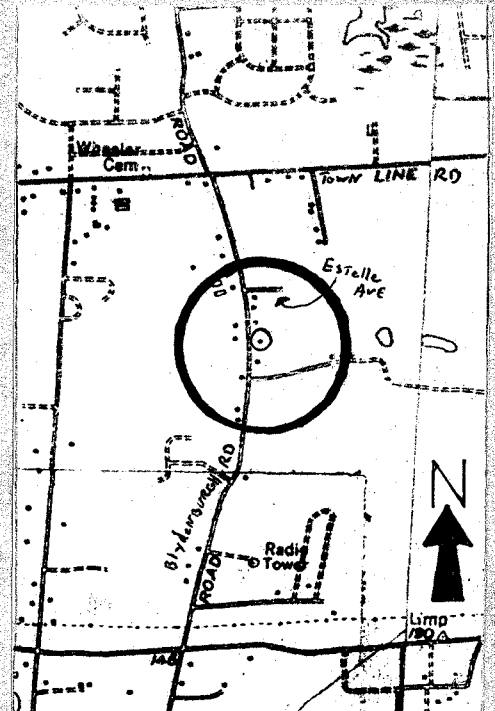

Blydenburgh Road, south of Town Line Road, East Hauppauge, New York



Records from the Hauppauge School District show that on August 6, 1908, it was voted to erect a schoolhouse in East Hauppauge. An appropriation of \$2,000 for the building and \$500 for the grounds and fencing was recorded.

In the minutes of October 31, 1908, Mr. Hand's bid of \$1,299 was accepted. The schoolhouse was erected in 1909 and served East Hauppauge until it was closed in 1940. The building was sold for \$800 to Olinto Parenti and subsequently converted into a residence which is still in use.
