

The Panzer House is located on a large, heavily landscaped parcel that borders Champlin Creek to the east. The house is located in a residential area characterized by smaller houses on smaller lots.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The Panzer House is a composite of parts of the Russell Mansion demolished in 1948. It is a large, 1½ story, steep hip roof, pink stucco house with clipped roof dormers and casement windows. A tall second story window on the principle (south) facade is decorated with an ornamental iron balcony, one of the recycled Russell Mansion features now part of this house.


