1. NAME OF DISTRICT: South Bay Avenue District

2. COUNTY: Suffolk TOWN/CITY: Islip VILLAGE: Islip

3. DESCRIPTION:

The South Bay Avenue District extends from south of Main Street to Raymond Street on the west side; and from Lazare Lane to #57 (IV-8) on the east side. It consists of fourteen houses of various architectural styles including two very well-preserved early 19th century residences - #57 (IV-8) AND #86 (IV-9).

4. SIGNIFICANCE:

The district is composed of substantial houses of interesting architectural variety, including two different Spanish styles of the 1920's; some in the Queen Anne Victorian vernacular; some Colonial revival; and one in English half-timber style. The two early houses were moved from Main Street. The district is especially notable for an old Victorian wood and pipe fence fronting #28 on the west side of the street and the iron fence with stone posts at #39.


Some of the houses have asphalt shingles.
