LIBRARY AT HOME

We saw a dramatic increase of **41%** in digital items borrowed through OverDrive and Hoopla with over **91,000** books, audiobooks, and music borrowed. An online Get a Card initiative was also implemented, with hundreds of membership applications and renewals being processed.




VIRTUAL CLASSES

Rather than merely posting pre-recorded sessions, our dedicated staff began adapting most classes and events to live virtual classes, meetings, and events with Zoom for all ages. Since launching this initiative in April, we have conducted close to **600** virtual classes with over **5,300** registrants!

COVID-19 RESPONSE

Preparations to reopen the facility and resume operations safely began from the **moment we closed our doors**. We reconfigured the entire floor plan, developed new occupancy restrictions and cleaning protocols, created new staffing guidelines, procured all requisite PPE, and installed hospital-grade HVAC filters.



PUTTING OUR COMMUNITY FIRST

This year, we were proud to be one of the **first** public libraries to offer curbside service and resume our normal hours of operation with limited in-person classes. The proposed property tax increase of 2.37% is **lower** than the NYS property tax cap and translates to \$7.20 per year for the average assessed home. This will ensure we maintain the level of service and safety our community deserves.

RESOLVED, that the budget as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the Connetquot Public Library for the year 2021-2022 in the amount of \$6,605,000 be approved and that the sum of \$6,389,000 be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of the Connetquot Central School District of Islip.

TRUSTEE ELECTION

Five-year term running from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2026. Trustee will be replacing Kathleen Schmidt, the incumbent. As of this printing, the candidate seeking election is Kathleen Schmidt.


