



ANNUAL REPORT 2022



This year, Connetquot Public Library continued to strive for excellence in service to our community as we unveiled a new Children & Family Services area which the community will enjoy for years to come. The roof on the north side of the building was replaced and partially funded by \$100,000 in NY State Aid. The proposed property tax increase of 2.5% is lower than the NYS property tax cap and translates to \$9.52 per year for the average assessed home. This will ensure we maintain the level of service and safety our community deserves.

PROPOSITION 1: BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the budget as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the Connetquot Public Library for the year 2023-2024 in the amount of \$6,908,900 be approved and that the sum of \$6,673,900 be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of the Connetquot Central School District of Islip.

TRUSTEE ELECTION

Five-year term running from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2028.

Limit of 15 boxes per vehicle. Electronic scrap will be transported to a secure facility to be destroyed that meets all state and federal standards. All documents will be shredded on-site for you to witness.
