

This year, Connetquot Public Library continued to expand our classes & events to meet an ever-growing demand from our community. We also continued to install energy-efficient LED lighting throughout the south wing of the facility. The proposed property tax increase of 2.9% is lower than the NYS property tax cap and translates to \$13.00 per year for the average assessed home. This will ensure we continue to expand our service offerings in order to provide our outstanding community with the modern public library experience they deserve!

WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?

PROPOSITION 1: BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the budget as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the Connetquot Public Library for the year 2025-26 in the amount of \$7,388,400 be approved and that the sum of \$7,032,400 be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of the Connetquot Central School District of Islip.

TRUSTEE ELECTION

Election of two (2) Library Trustees. The candidate receiving the most votes filling a five (5) year term beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2030, and the candidate receiving the second most votes filling a term beginning immediately after the election, and ending on June 30, 2028.
